A RESOLUTION

EXPRESSING SYMPATHY AND CONDOLENCES ON THE  
DEATH OF FIRE DEPARTMENT CAPTAIN WILLIAM A. LIGHTBODY.

WHEREAS, William A. Lightbody, Captain of the Fire Department of the City of Youngstown, Ohio, died August 6th, from a heart attack induced by smoke inhalation and undue stress and strain while directing operations of the Fire Department at a residential fire August 3, 1964, on Hayman Street; and

WHEREAS, the cause is one occurring in line of duty; and

WHEREAS, Captain Lightbody was born in Youngstown, Ohio, January 25, 1916, a son of William H. and Eva Summers Lightbody, and was 48 years of age at time of his passing; and

WHEREAS, he was a native son of Youngstown, living here all his life, and attending East High School; and

WHEREAS, he had been a tool grinder with the Youngstown Sheet and Tube Co. and became a Cadet Fireman in September, 1939, and was promoted to first class fireman in 1940, engineer in 1947 and Captain October 16, 1950, and was Secretary of the Fireman's Pension Board; and

WHEREAS, he engaged in fighting in many of the important fires during his period in the fire department, such as St. Columba's Cathedral, the Youngstown Club, and was injured twice, once in the Pick-Ohio Hotel fire on the 8th floor and another time while fighting a garage fire; and

WHEREAS, he was a member and trustee of the Tabernacle United Presbyterian Church; a member of the International Association of Firefighters, Local 312, Western Star Lodge No. 21, F.&A.M., Aut Mori Grotto, Safety Unit of the Grotto and Scottish Rite Valley of Youngstown; and



WHEREAS, Captain Lightbody leaves surviving him, his wife, Sylvia Magni, three daughters, Mrs. Gloria Aepli of Poland, Misses Elda Mae and Eva Jean at home; a sister, Mrs. Randall Bramer of Youngstown; a step-sister, Mrs. Fred Dickinson of Toronto, Canada, and one grandchild.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF YOUNGSTOWN, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1

That the sympathy and condolences of the Council and Administration of the City of Youngstown, Ohio, are expressed to his family and friends, on the passing of our good friend, associate and faithful fellow worker who has served us and the citizens of Youngstown so well and faithfully for so many years, and given his life in such service.
