Stewart is listed as a current member of the Local #8 in the list of members also placed within the cornerstone in 1908. He appears with the office of Int. Deputy on the membership list as well.

George's obituary as it appeared in the Youngstown Telegram indicates the couple had ten children, five whom were still living in 1906.

George Porter LOGAN<sup>6, 32-34, 36, 38-39, 47, 51, 95</sup> emigrated from Youngstown, Mahoning County, OH in 1861<sup>45, 47</sup>. He served in the military between 1861-1865 (1st Sergeant, Company C 44th USCT<sup>45, 47, 51, 105</sup>). He lived in 327 Clyde Street, Youngstown, OH in 1906<sup>51</sup>. He was buried on 28 Oct 1906 in Oak Hill Cemetery, Youngstown, OH<sup>106-108</sup>. His cause of death was paralysis<sup>51</sup>. He was employed as a bricklayer<sup>45, 47, 51</sup>. George Logan volunteered 26 September 1864 in Youngstown, OH and was duly recorded by recruiting agent F. O. Arms. His record indicates George was promoted from private to sergeant February 1, 1865. He was mustered out October 10, 1865 by reason of expiration of term of service at Nashville, TN or Huntsville, AL.

# Old Rayen School Was Built ByBlack Brick Mason in 1866

By E. WAYNE ROBINSON (Sixth of eight articles on Youngstown's black history).

Problems being experienced by blacks trying to get into the construction trades in the Youngstown area today are a far cry from the middle 1800s when two black master brick masons were being actively wooed by community leaders to erect some of the city's best known edifices.

P. Ross Berry and Lemuel Stewart and their families came from New Castle, Pa., by canal boat bringing with them brick masonry skills which were to help in the development of the burgeoning industrial city on the Mahoning River.

For about 15 to 20 years up into the 1900s Berry, with the assistance of Stewart, was the only brick mason contractor in the town. He soon became one of the best known and respected work which was in great de-





And the plaintiff further says "Callahan Brothers is in debted to and has property money and rights in action of the said P. Ross Berry in their possession of the said P. Ross Berry in their possession and under their control adn that the said P. Ross Berry has property which he unjustly refuses to apply to the satisfaction of the said judgement." Call for Zadoch Callahan and Delorma Callahan, operating as Callahan Brothers to appear before court in this matter.

Mahoning County, Ohio Probate Court, Probate Civil Case File #1357 Erskine, James vs. Berry, P. Ross et al. (Original case file in MVHS Collections): Callahan Brothers say "about the 20 day of August A.D. 1879, they entered into a contract with said P. Ross Berry by the terms of which said Berry agreed to build for them a brick building on their premises in the City of Youngstown and to complete the same in three weeks from the time of commencing said work and in default of the completion of said building in said period of time said P. R. Berry was to forfeit to them of the amount to be due and payable from them to said Berry the sum of fifteen dollars per day for every day said building was incomplete after the expiration of three weeks from the time of commencing said work. That if said building was completed witing said time, these defendents were to pay to said Berry the sum of fifteen hundred and fifty dollars to be due and payable as follows" herewith a schedule of payments is laid out in the document. "...the said Berry had the first story completed and about one half of the second story, and had received from these defendents the sum of \$1200.14 and were not indebted to him in any sum but had overpaid him to the amount of \$700.14." The Callahans petitioned the court to dismiss any further amounts believed to be owed to Berry. James Erskine claims a judgement of #248.70 with \$3.60 taxes against Berry. These proceedings were dismissed at the cost of the plaintiff ad the garnishes against Callahan found "nothing in their hands belonging to said Defendant."

Mahoning County, Ohio Probate Court, Probate Civil Case File #1361 James Erskine vs. P. Ross Berry et al. (Original case file in MVHS Collections):

Summons to have Zadock Callahan and Delorma Callahan, partners doing business as Callahan Brothers, to appear before the Probate Judge, 29 November 1879 to answer the "indebtedness of them to P. Ross Berry and also concerning any property in their hands belonging to the said P. Ross Berry the defendent herein. This order is granted upon the affidavit of James Erskine to subject the monies, rights, credits and closes in action and any other property that may be in the hands of the said Zadock Callahan and Delorma Callahan belonging to the said P. Ross Berry to the satisfaction of a Judgement of \$248.70 debt and \$3.60 costs and increase costs rendered

against said P. Ross Berry by Samuel R. Megown in the 24th day of October 1879 then a Justice of the Peace in and for the township of Youngstown Mahoning County, Ohio." Ordered 15 November 1879.
