At a meeting of the inhabitants legal voters of the Township of Coitsville on Monday 2nd day of April in the year 1821 the electors met to choose town officers for the ensuing year and proceeded and made choice of William Swan, Ammi R. Bissell and Daniel Augustine, Judges of said meeting. They being duly sworn proceeded and made choice of Ira Allerton, Town Clerk and George Monteith, assistant for said election. William McFarlin, Ammi R. Bissell, George Monteith, Trustees; William Crawford, William Reed, Joseph Jackson, John G. McCormick, William Bissell, James Kennedy, Jr., Supervisors; David Brownlee, James Welch, Overseers of the Poor; James Crawford, John Stewart, fence viewers; James Linn, treasurer; William Swan, Constable and lister; Ira Allerton, Town Clerk.

Coitsville April 2nd, 1821. Personally appeared before James Shields, Justice of the Peace, William McFarlin, Ammi R. Bissell, and George Monteith, Trustees; and were duly sworn to perform said office done in presence of Ira Allerton, Town Clerk.

Coitsville, April 2nd, 1821 Personally appeared before James Shields, Justice of the Peace, William Crawford, Joseph Jackson and William Bissell, Supervisors and was sworn according to law to perform said office, done in presence of Ira Allerton, T. Clerk.

Coitsville, April 6th, 1821 Personally appeared before the subscriber James Crawford, fence viewer and was sworn according to law to perform said office, Ira Allerton, T. C.

A Book of Records of the doings of the Trustees and other Officers of the Township of Coitsville, County of Trumbull.

Coitsville April 25th, 1807 At a meeting of William Houston, Joseph Jackson, and William Stewart, Trustees for the Township of Coitsville. Ordered that Ebenezer Corey one of the Supervisors of Highways, to have the Youngstown road from the post between lot 13 and 14 on said road east to the state line, and north from said post to Hubbardsville and William Martin, A Supervisor to have Youngstown road from said post west to the

Township line and all roads south of Youngs-Town Road and said Corey to have all the lands north of Youngs-Town Road and said Martin is to have all the lands south of said road. We likewise unanimously agree that our annual place of meeting shall be the place formerly occupied by John P. Bissel, Esq. William Houston, Joseph Jackson, William Stewart.

At a meeting of Messrs. William Houston, Joseph Jackson, and William Stewart, Trustees, at the Dwelling house of Joseph Bissell in the Township of Coitsville, County of Trumbull, on the 9th day of October 1807, ordered a tax to be made on the inhabitants of said township equal to the county tax for making, mending said highways in said township according to law. Pursuant to the above orders made duplicates, one delivered to Ebenezer Corey, Supervisor of Highways, North District, one to William Martin, Supervisor of Highways, South District, on the 13 day of October 1807. Attest Joseph Bissell, T. Clerk.

Stewart, and Joseph Jackson, Trustees for the Town of Coitsville, at the Dwelling house of Joseph Bissell, in said town, to settle the accounts of the Supervisors, Overseers of the Poor, Treasurer, etc. None made their appearance to exhibit their accounts, therefore this meeting is adjourned to the 4th day of April next. Coitsville, April 4th, 1808. At an adjourned meeting of the Trustees, March 7th, met here accordingly and Ebenezer Corey, Supervisor of Highways, exhibited his account and due to him two dollars and fifty-five cents, and William Martin, Supervisor of Highways exhibited his account and due him one dollar and twenty two cents John McCall and Timothy Swan, Overseers of the Poor no accounts to exhibit. Meeting adjourned without delay. April 2, 1810 Paid to Wm. Martin by James Stewart, Supervisor half a day work. Attest Joseph Bissel, Town Clerk.

Coitsville, April 4th, 1810. At a meeting of William Houston, Joseph Jackson, and William Stewart, Trustees for the Township of Coitsville, ordered that John Potter one of the Supervisors of Highways to begin at the Bridge called dry run, on the road to the state line east from said bridge, to be the South East Quarter. Mathew Robb beginning at said bridge running south to Poland line and the highways south of Youngs-Town road, to be the South West Quarter. James Bradford, a Supervisor, to begin at the dry run bridge including said bridge on the road to Youngs-Town Line to be the North West Quarter, and to David Wilson Supervisor to begin at a post marked 13, 14, 16, 17 on the road to Hubbardsville to be the North East Quarter. Attest Joseph Bissell, Town Clerk.

At a meeting of William Houston, Joseph Jackson, and William Stewart, Trustees for the Township of Coitsville

at the dwelling house of Joseph Bissell of said town on April 27th, 1808. Ordered that every person subject to pay a county tax, according to an act passed by the General Assembly of the state of Ohio December 24th, 1807, to kill ten squirrels, and in addition to the ten squirrels, each person to kill two squirrels for each cow and four for each horse, and if a person has but one cow she is exempted. Coitsville June 27th, 1808 At a meeting of the inhabitants legally warned and convened at the house of Joseph Bissell in the Town of Coitsville, voted that no road tax should be raised for mending and repairing the roads for the present year. And also voted that the Squirrel Act be continued to the first day of August next before returns are made to the collector of County taxes. Attest Joseph Bissell, T. Clerk.

Coitsville March 13th, 1809. Wm. Houston, Joseph Jackson, and Wm. Stewart, Trustees met at the dwelling house of Joseph Bissell to settle accounts with the supervisors, overseers of the poor, etc. James Bradford exhibited his account and due to Asa Mariner for one day work on the highway, and to David Wilson, supervisor to half a days work, and to Mathew Robb, ditto, to half a days work on the highway; and due from Ebenezer Corey one dollar and 24 cents. Meeting adjourned to the first Monday of April next by the trustees. Attest Joseph Bissell, Town Clerk.

April Monday 3rd, 1809. Trustees met according to adjournment and no accounts exhibited therefore dismissed etc. April 2nd, 1810. James Shields, Treasurer, paid Joseph Bissell two dollars by order of the trustees. April 3, 1809.

Coitsville, April 21, 1809. At a meeting of John Johnson Amos Loveland and Alexander Reed, Trustees for the Town of Coitsville ordered that James Linn, one of the supervisors of highways for the present year, to begin on the road on the Pennsylvania line, running west to a post marked 13, 14, 16, 17 from thence south on the road to Yellow Creek, there to the River Mahoning to the West line of the Township, and said Linn, to have all the hands east of the center line. And also James Stewart the other Supervisor to begin at Hubbardsville Township on the road by Joseph Bissell's to a post marked 13, 14, 16, 17, from there thence to Youngs Town Road and over the south side of Mahoning River by Amos Lovelands to the Town line to William McCombs, and a road running south from said Lovelands on the South west corner of Coitsville, the one half belonging to said Stewart, on the State Road, and said Stewart to have all hands on the west side of the center line. In order etc. Attest Joseph Bissell, Town Clerk.

At a meeting of the trustees of the town of Coitsville September A.D. 1809 ordered a tax to be made on the inhabitants, equal to the county tax, for making mending highways in said town and according to said orders made duplicates, and delivered one to James Linn, Supervisor of Highways for the East District and one to James Stewart, Supervisor for the West District on the 7th and 10th days of October, 1809. Attest Joseph Bissell Town Clerk.

At a meeting of the trustees of the town of Coitsville and the trustees of the Town of Youngs Town county of Trumbull on the 30th day of September 1809, they agreed to divide the road equally between then on the town line, the inhabitants of the town of Coitsville to begin at the Southwest Corner post and run north 180 rods on the town line, to mend, make, and keep it in repair, and the other part running north on said line to belong to the inhabitants of Youngs-Town as agreed upon by said trustees to mend, make, and keep it in repair according to law.

Coitsville March 5th, 1810; Amos Loveland, John Johnson, and Alexander Reed, Trustees, met at the house of Joseph Bissell, to settle accounts with the Supervisors, etc. James Linn one of the supervisors exhibited his account and due him two dollars and 95 cents, and James Mears exhibited his account and due him 45 cents for warning Elizabeth Ewart out of town. And appointed William Houston and Barnabas Harriss Grand Jury for the court of Common Pleas, and Joseph Robinson, David Cooper and John Stewart, petit jury for the court of Common Pleas Timothy Swan Grand Jury for the Supreme Court, and John Potter petit jury for the s. court. Joseph Bissell account three dollars. Meeting adjourned by the Trustees to Monday the 2nd day of April next to meet at nine o'clock in the morning. Trustees met according to adjournment, and James Stewart, Supervisor exhibited his account and due him three dollars and 55 cents.

April 7th, 1810. All the above exhibited accounts is answered and paid in full by James Shields, Treasurer.

Ordered that Samuel McBride, Supervisor of Highways to begin at the post marked 13, 14, 16, 17 running to Poland line then beginning at Poland line running to Joseph Robinson's including Alexander Reed and James Shields. And to Wm. McFarland to begin at the post marked 13, 14, 16, 17 running to the Ponter by Brown's barn to Stewart's mill, then down the road to Joseph Robinson's including said Robinson, and the road by Amos Loveland's on the town line 180 rods, and another road on said Loveland's to Wm. McComb's to Poland line. And to James Welch to begin at Hubbardsville Line including John McCrerey, Wm. Orrick and Wm. Orrick, Jr., on the road by Joseph Bissell's to a post marked 13, 14, 16, 17 then north to James Bradford's Corner of his lot then west to Youngs-Town Line and to Barnabas Harriss to begin at the post marked 13, 14, 16, 17; to Pennsylvania Line to have the hands on the N. East quarter except John McCrerey, Wm. Orrick, and Wm. Orrick, Jr.

Coitsville, March 4th, 1811 Daniel Mentieth, Amos Loveland and Alexander Reed, Trustees, met at the dwelling house of Joseph Bissell to settle accounts with the supervisors of highways, overseers of the poor, etc. James Welch, a Supervisor, exhibited his account and due to him two dollars, eighty-seven cents and received an order on the treasurer from the trustees. Joseph Bissell exhibited his account and due to him two dollars and received an order on the treasurer from the trustees. Trustees gave orders to Benj. Fitch Constable to warn a town meeting on Monday the first day of April next according to law. Meeting adjourned by the trustees to the first day of April next to meet at ten of the clock in the mornings.

Trustees met according to adjournment and Samuel McBride exhibited his account and due to him thirty three cents, and gave an order on the treasurer, and William McFarland exhibited his account and due him two dollars and 25 cents and gave an order on the treasurer. Barnabas Harriss has no account against the township to exhibit. Meeting dismissed by the trustees.

April 10th, received two dollars on the above account in full. Joseph Bissell.

At a meeting of Alexander Reed, Timothy Swan and James Linn, Trustees for the Town of Coitsville April 6th, 1811. Ordered that William Houston, Supervisor of Highways to begin at the Cross roads at the Pointers, to Pennsylvania line to have the hands on the North East Quarter, except William Orrick and William Orrick, Jr., including Rev. William Wick. And to William Stewart, Supervisor, to begin at the cross roads at the pointers, and on the road by Joseph Bissells to Hubbardsville line including Wm. Orrick and Wm. Orrick, Jr. Then north from the pointers to James Bradford's corner of his lot, then west to Young-Town line for the Northwest Quarter. Joseph Bissel exhibited his account and due two dollars, and received an order on the treasurer, and at the same time the trustees appointed Amos Loveland, Joseph Jackson, William Stewart, and John McCall, Grand Jurors. Joseph Beggs, Mathew Robb, James Welch, and David Wilson, Petit Jurors for the County of Trumbull the year ensuing. Meeting adjourned by the trustees to the 6th day of April next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon. Trustees met according to adjournment, viz Timothy Swan, and James Linn, no accounts exhibited. Ordered that David Wilson, Supervisor of Highways, to begin at the Cross Roads, at the pointers to Pennsylvania Line, to have the hands on the NE quarter except McCrery farm, the two William Orricks and Alex. McGuffy. John Stewart, Supervisor, to begin at Hubbard Line south to the pointers at the Cross Roads including McGuffy and all hands north of Dry Run taking John Breden on the south of Dry Run. Thomas Clark, Supervisor, all hands south of Dry Run except John Breden, and S. West hands except Basil Pool and Thomas Cassidy to begin

March 6, 1814 At a meeting of the James Bradford and John Houston, Trustees, David Willson, Supervisor, settled had no account to exhibit, Alexander Reed, Town Clerk, presented his bill. 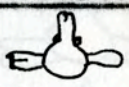
